WILDEYE BREWING (1385 MAIN ST) OR  
ONLINE VIA [NORTHSHORECULTURECOMPASS.CA](http://NORTHSHORECULTURECOMPASS.CA)

Duelling piano nights, seasonal collabs (peach bellini-inspired beer – yes please!), a pet-friendly patio, this brewery has it all and is only two minutes away from the bridge featured in Clue 9!

**In-person clue:** What part of this brewery features an eye and is surrounded by feathers? Take the second letter!

**Online clue:**  

Head to the [northshoreculturecompass.ca](http://northshoreculturecompass.ca) and navigate to the 'Creative & Cultural Industries' Category using the icons above. Type the brewery name in the search bar, select it, and navigate to the location. Speaking of music, what music store is next to the brewery? Click on the wayfinder and take the 2nd letter!

## CLUE 11:

DEEP COVE BREWERS AND DISTILLERS  
(2270 DOLLARTON HIGHWAY UNIT 170) OR  
ONLINE VIA [NORTHSHORECULTURECOMPASS.CA](http://NORTHSHORECULTURECOMPASS.CA)

This is a great place to stop on the way back from a day trip to Deep Cove or Mount Seymour! As well as beer, they also offer small-batch spirits and showcase live musicians every weekend!

**In-person clue:** What is the name of their speciality beer that is a blend of lager and cider? Take the last letter!

**Online clue:**  

Head to the [northshoreculturecompass.ca](http://northshoreculturecompass.ca) and navigate to the 'Public Art' Category using the icons above. Type the brewery name in the search bar, select it, and navigate to the location. Just west of the brewery across the street is a piece of public art representing the nest of which bird? Click on the wayfinder and take the last letter of the bird to get your clue!

Have you found all the letters and unscrambled them to find the code word?

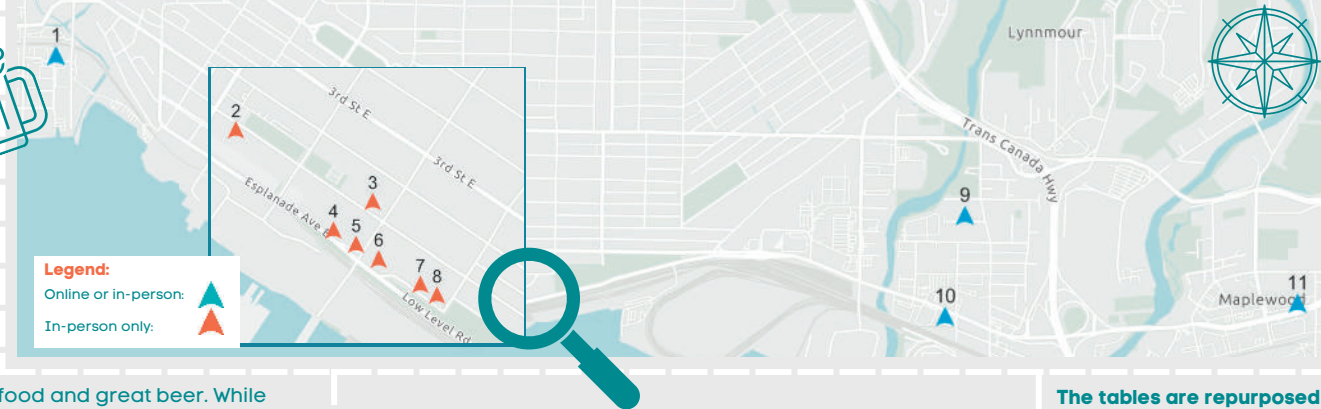

**CLUE 7:**

**HOUSE OF FUNK BREWING (350 ESPLANADE E #101)**

This community-based brewery focuses on experimental brewing, creating small batches that ferment in big wooden vessels, adding an oaky flavour to their brews. They also push boundaries through their furniture choice: so much so, that the tables are not just tables...

**The tables are repurposed \_\_\_\_\_? Take the second (or third) letter for your next clue!**

**CLUE 8:**

**BRAGGOT BREWING (370 ESPLANADE E #102)**

Can't decide between drinking mead or beer? No problem! This brewery has brought back an ancient recipe made by fermenting local honey from their bee hives in Delta with grains, bringing the best of both worlds to your taste buds. Make sure to check out the framed article while you're there to find out more!

Take a moment to admire the logo on the east wall. This compass includes solstices, equinoxes, roman numerals, lunar cycles and more!

**At which compass direction do you find 'Excalibur'? Take the last letter of the direction as your next clue!**

**Pro Tip:**

Remaining clues can be found in-person at the breweries or online via the northshoreculturecompass.ca - your choice!  
Note: there is a 45 minute walk from Clue 8 to Clue 9.  
The treasure hunt can be completed over multiple sessions!



**CLUE 9:**

**BRIDGE BREWING (1448 CHARLOTTE RD) OR ONLINE VIA NORTHSHORECULTURECOMPASS.CA**

Bridge Brewing has two locations pouring everyday. They have been known to create a beer to raise funds for North Shore Rescue and they also named one of their IPAs after those who built the bridge over the Second Narrows. The bridge itself was renamed in memory of the 19 workers who died in a tragic accident in 1958 during construction. Anyone hear Stompin' Tom?

**In person:** There's a beer named after the bridge. Take the last letter of the first word of the beer name!

**Online clue:**

Head to the northshoreculturecompass.ca by selecting the icon above for 'all categories'. Type in the name 'Second Narrows Bridge' and click on it to see what the bridge was renamed after the accident. Take the last letter of the first word!

This brewery aims to bring the flavour of Mexico to the Shipyards District and the name translates as 'The Shipyards Brewery'. Make sure to try the Salted Lime Lager!

**The exterior, the interior, and even the beers are covered in blue and white \_\_\_\_\_? Take the 4th letter of this word!**

**CLUE 5:**

**SHAKETOWN BREWING CO (288 ESPLANADE E #105)**

Did you know that part of Lynn Valley was originally known as "Shaketown"? Before it was famous for world-class mountain biking trails, this highly forested area was well known for the cedar shingles made here in the late 19th and early 20th centuries and 'shake' is another word for shingle. Flumes were used to transport harvested timber to the waterfront and since they were essentially long wooden waterslides, workers used them as a way of commuting!

**Moving from actual history to the brewery's 'Tall Tales', who was a Shaketown's fictitious first Mayor? Take the 3rd letter of his last name for this clue!**

**HINT:** An illustration of this notable Shaketonian can be found on the exterior of the brewery, along with a very compromising news article detailing his shenanigans - to take with with a pinch of salt!

For real stories about North Shore history, head to the 'Intangibles & Stories' Category of the North Shore Culture Compass.

**CLUE 6:**

**BEERE BREWING CO. (312 ESPLANADE E)**

This father and son operation was destined to become a reality considering that their surname is 'Beere' and it did so in 2017! You may well be a few bevies in by this point, so we'll make this one easy for you.

**This clue appears four times in the neon sign on the west wall. Which letter is it? There's your clue!**

**CLUE 1:**

**BLACK KETTLE BREWING COMPANY (720 COPPING ST) OR ONLINE VIA NORTHSHORECULTURECOMPASS.CA**

Next time you're out adventuring on one of the North Shore's trails,

stop here for some tasty post-hike food and great beer. While you're sipping on the pale ale, take note of the name.

**In-person clue:** The 2nd letter of the pale ale's name is your clue!

**Online clue:**

Navigate to the 'First Nations' Category of the northshoreculturecompass.ca using the icons above. Type the brewery name in the search bar, select it, and zoom into the location. Click on the closest red waypoint that features a piece of public art: a bird symbolising light, knowledge and creativity. What is the first letter of the bird's name?

While you're here, click on the paw prints to learn more about animals in Coast Salish culture and Skwxwú7mesh pronunciations!

**CLUE 2:**

**WALK TO THE BREWERY AT 123A 1ST ST E**

This brewery's name was inspired by an early mode of public transit on the North Shore that ran from 1912 - 1946. Route 3 passed near this location! Enter the cozy tasting room for a beverage!

**Which mode of transit was it? Take the 7th letter - there's Clue 2!**

Hint: the nearby museum, MONOVA, has one on display in the lobby.

**CLUE 3:**

**NORTH POINT BREWERY (266 1ST ST E)**

At the North Shore Culture Compass, we love cardinal points, and this brewery has one in its name! Nestled in a cabin style location, this setting reminds us how the early settlers lived here on the North Shore. It was founded by three best friends!

**What kind of IPA is their year-round beer, 'Life of Riley'? Take the first letter!**

**CLUE 4:**

**LA CERVECERIA ASTILLEROS (226 ESPLANADE E)**

Although the North Vancouver Burrard Dry Dock company was well established before World War 2, after the fall of France in 1940, a call for help from London kickstarted a huge shipbuilding effort as 14,000 new employees started working around the clock. Packed ferries took them to and from Vancouver and thousands of new homes were built to support the influx of activity!
